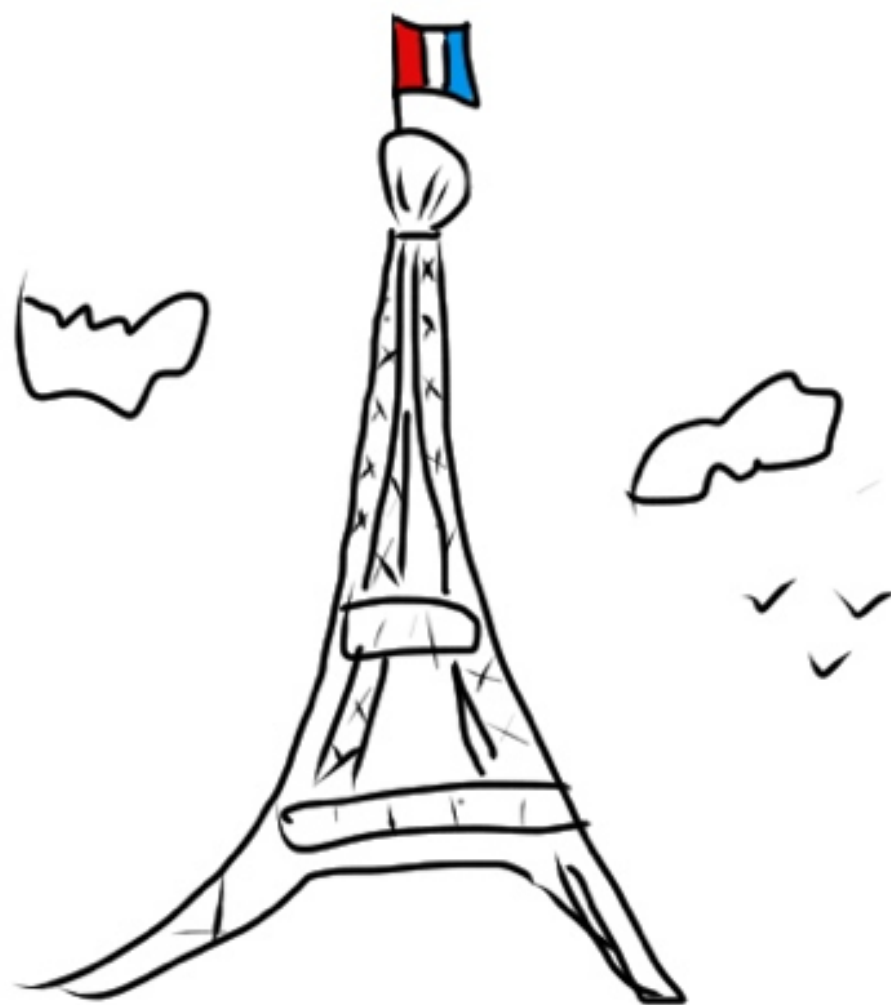

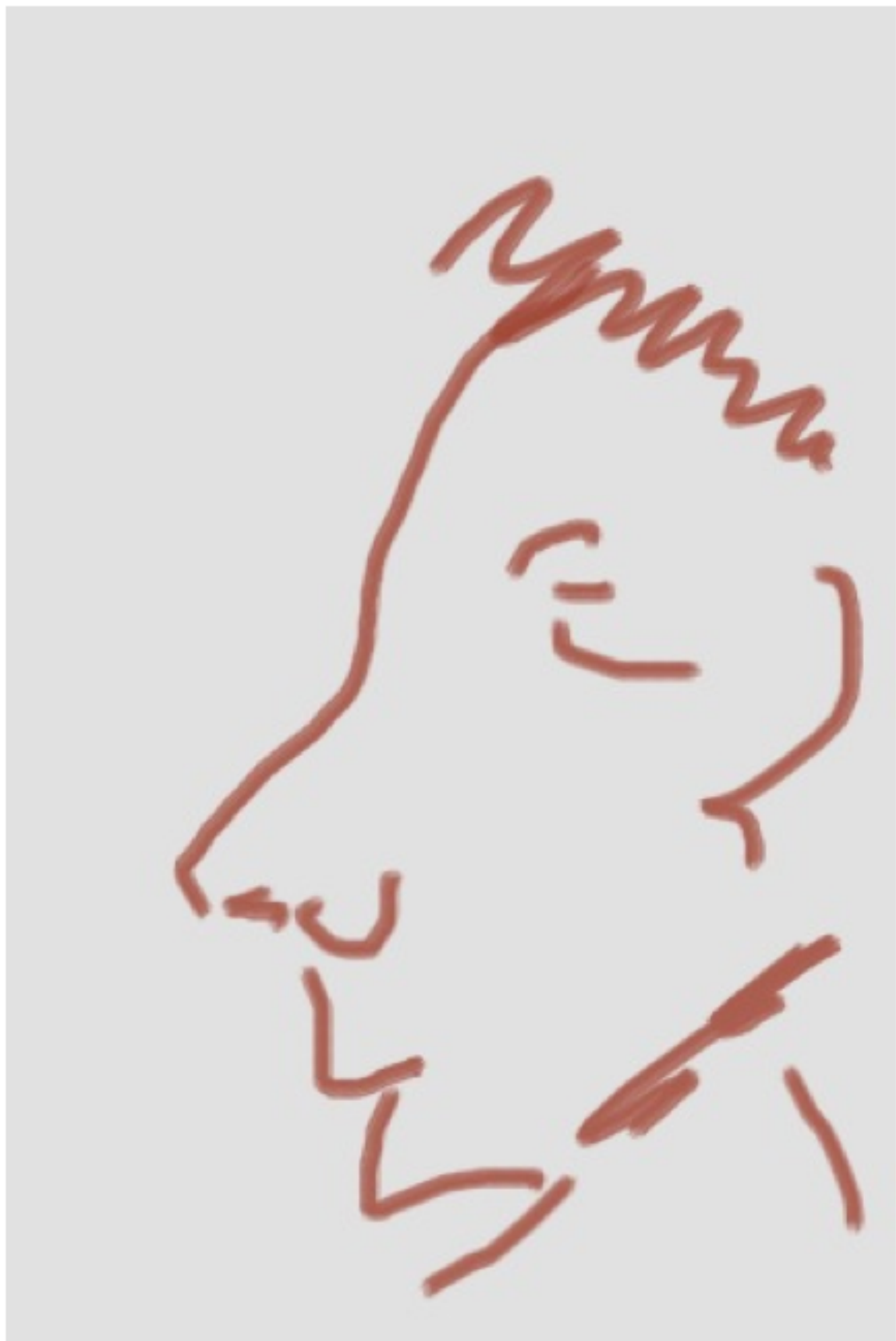

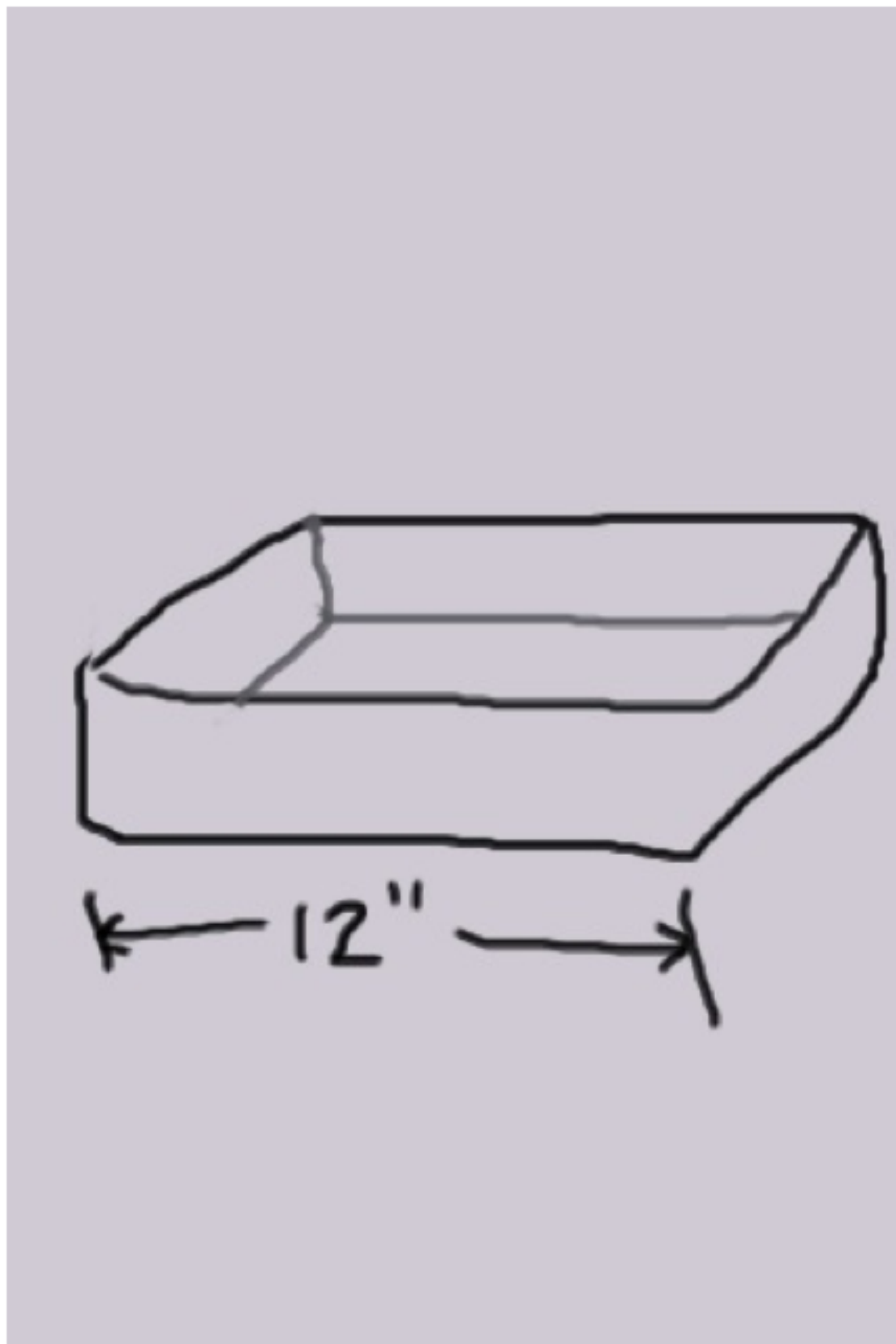




Mrs. Maypole's 12-inch Pyrex baking dish has been stolen, and she has a pretty good idea who did it.

Farmer Dan and Tilley Wachtel were often seen together at The Gators Lounge.

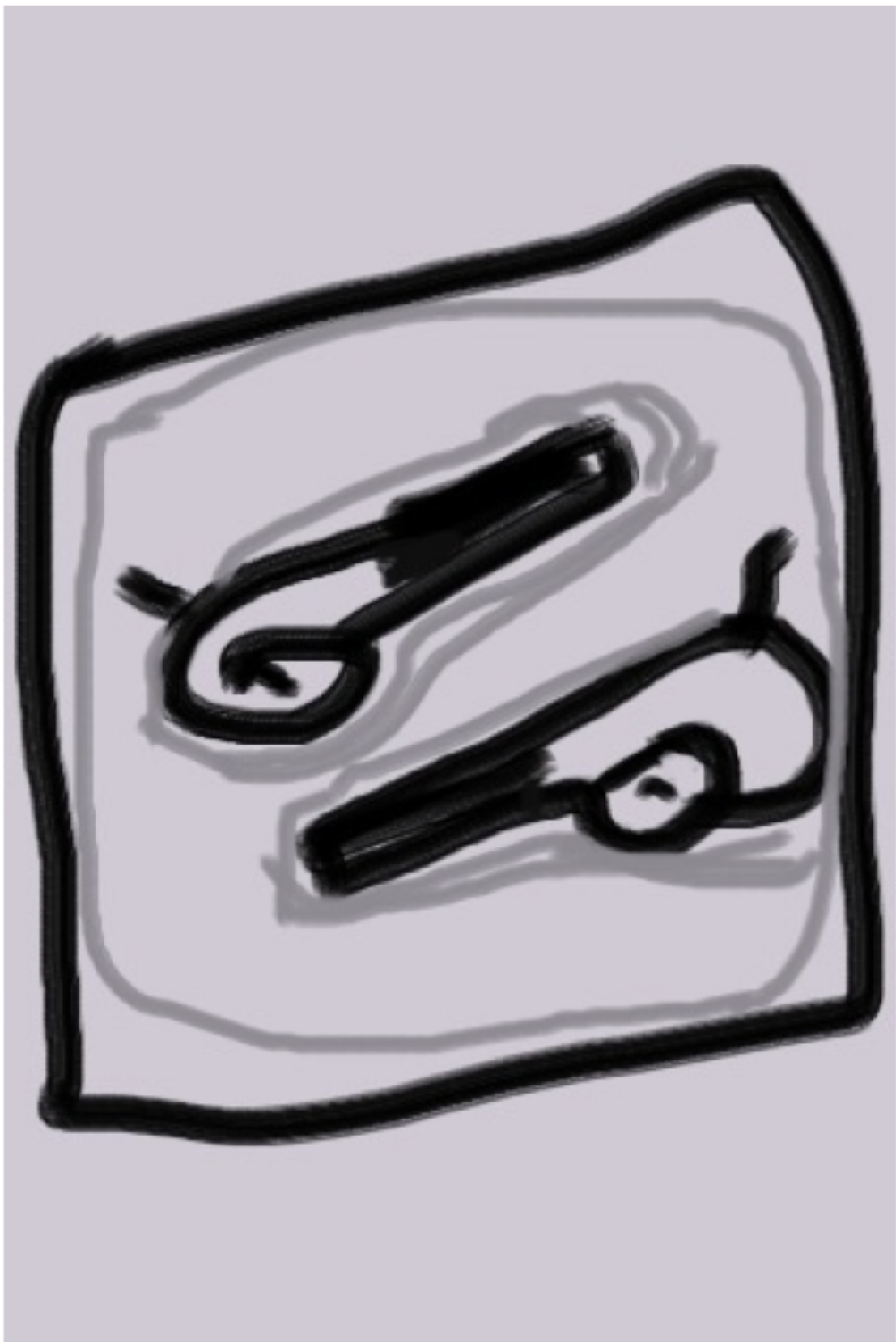


Harry Wachtel, the town banker and Tilley's husband, couldn't help but overhear all the town gossip about Tilley and Farmer Dan.





He didn't like it one bit, nor Mrs. Maypole's dirty looks, either.



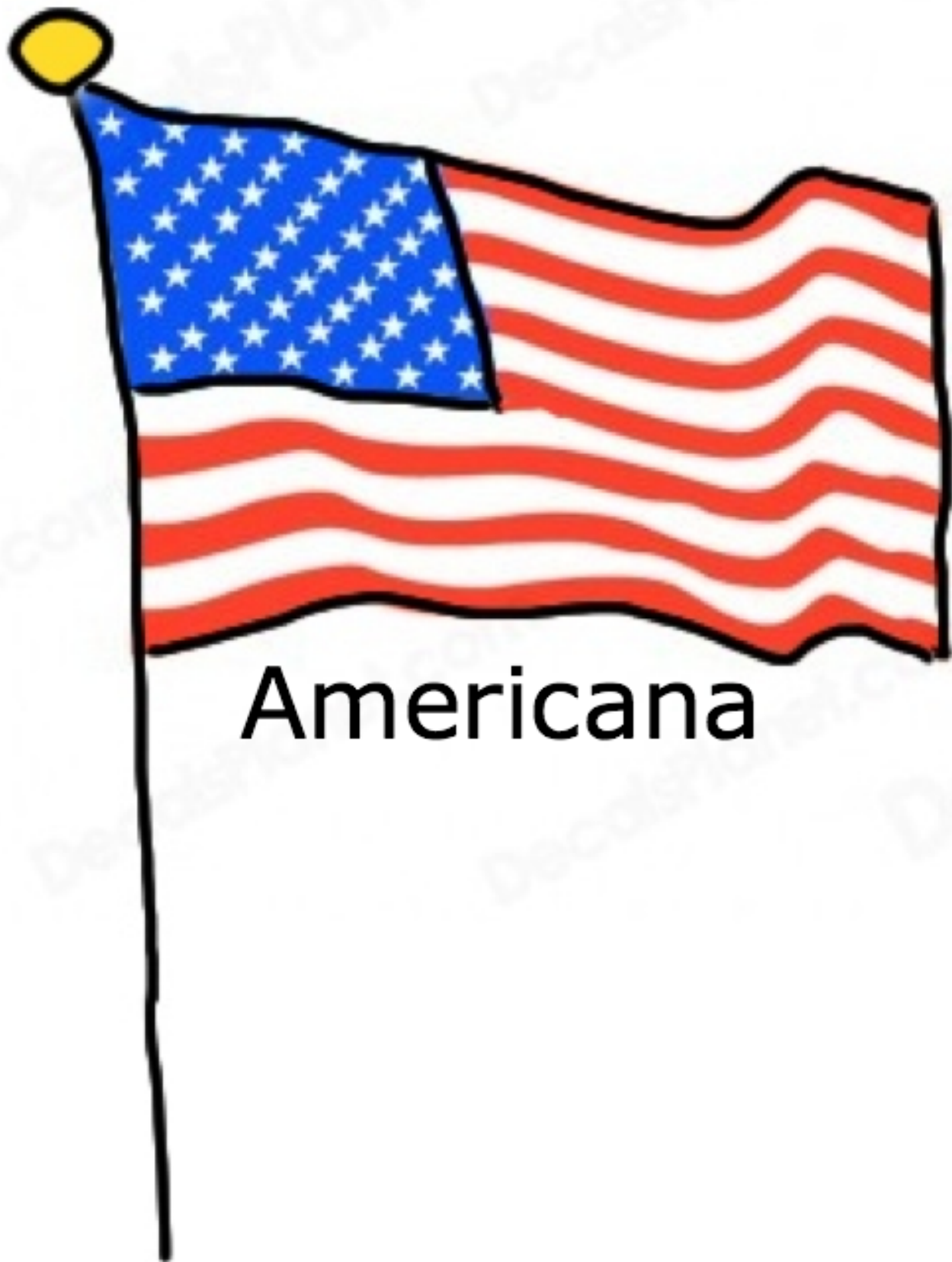
Harry challenged Farmer Dan to a duel with pistols at twenty paces.

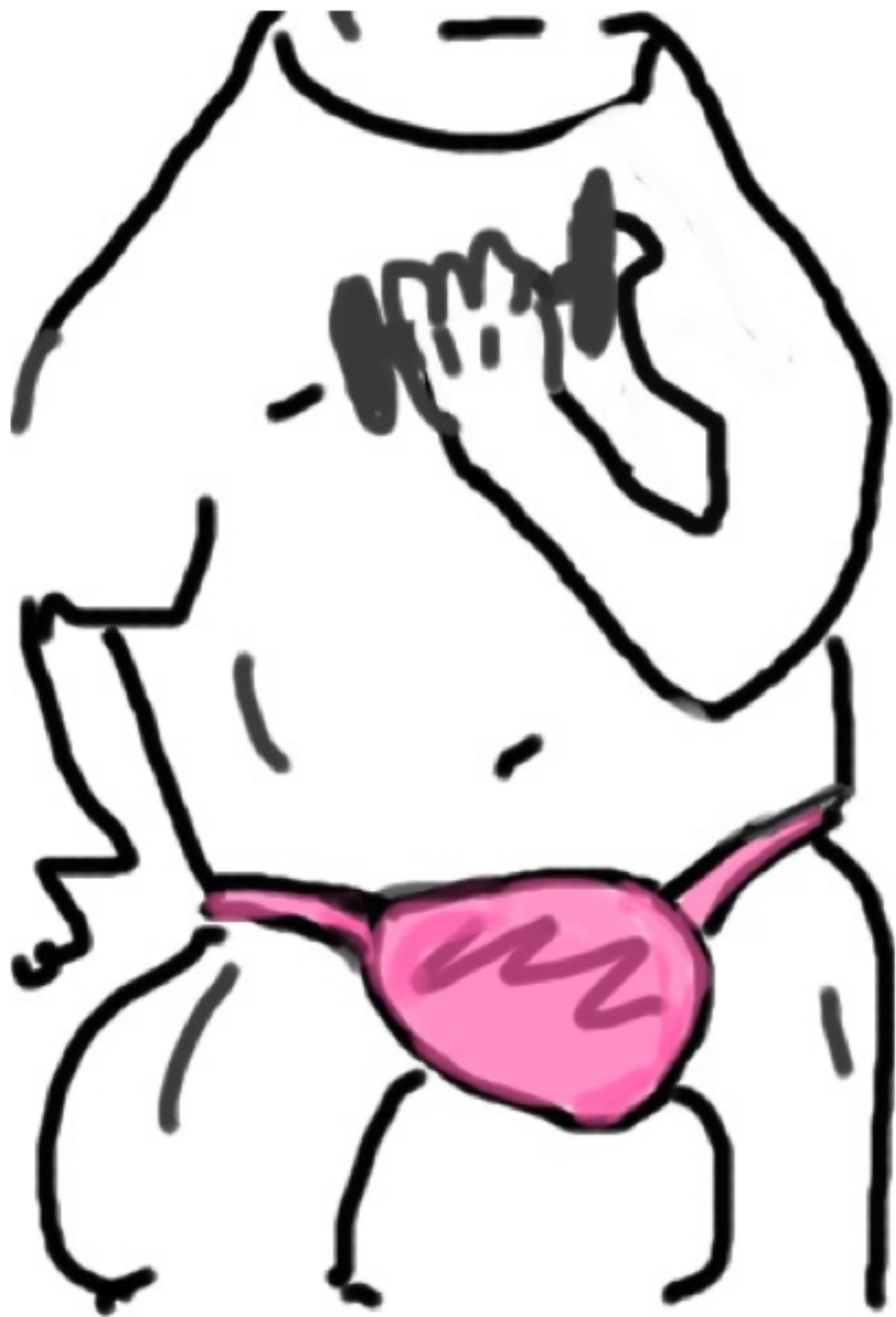


Ever since he got his banana phone, Leonard has been a public nuisance.





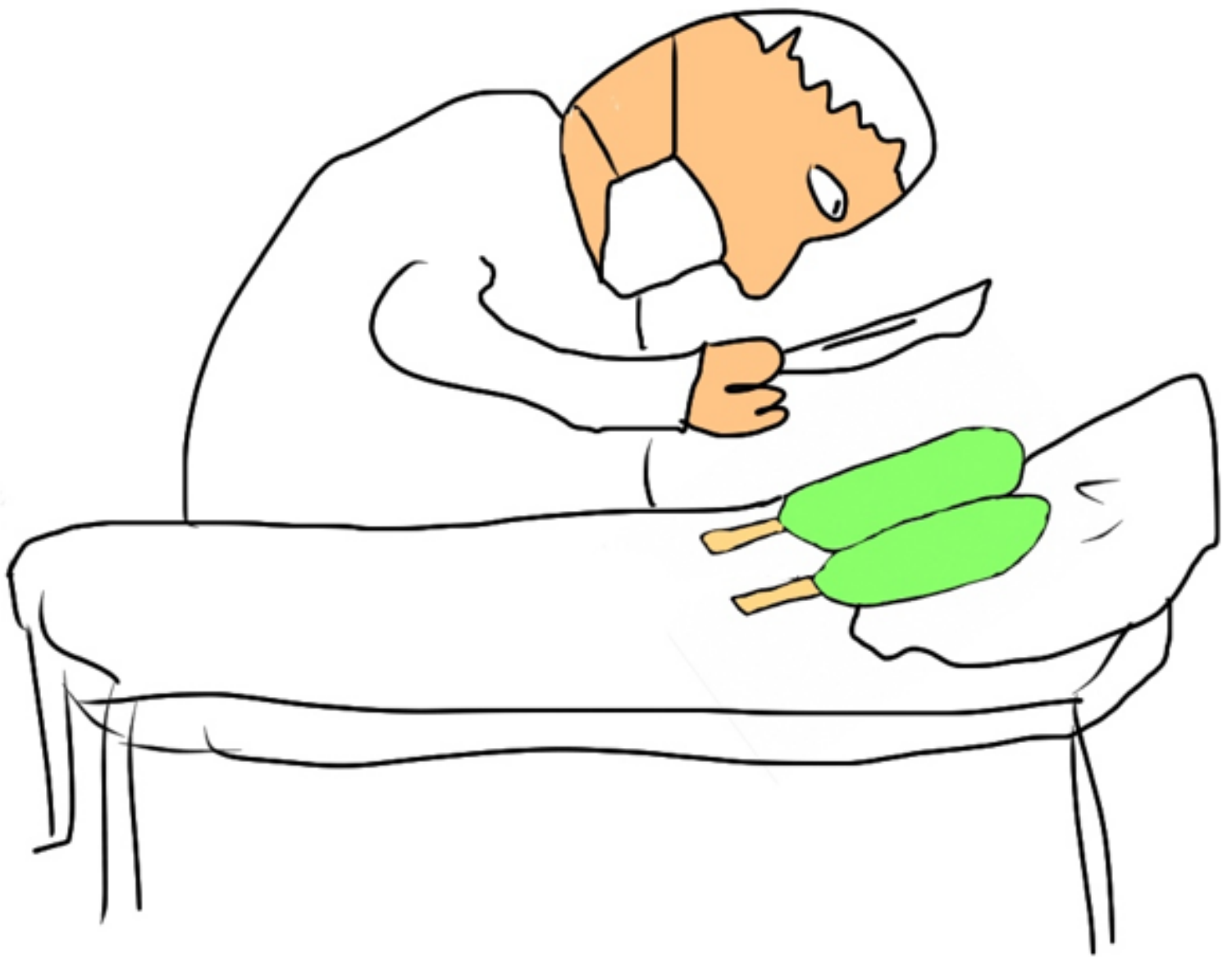
Raymond starts to realize the person in the mirror is showing his age.



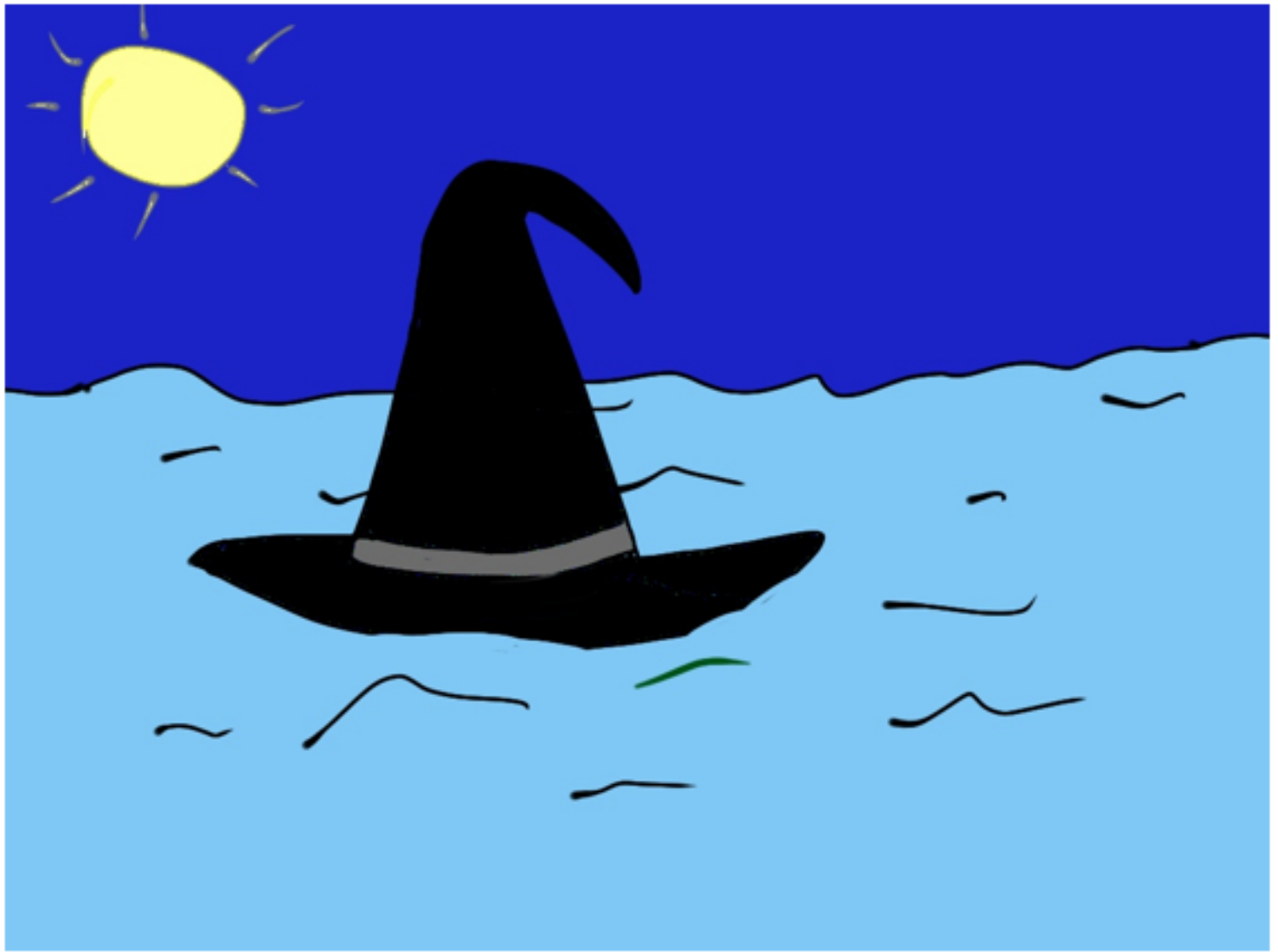
Kenny tells women he has his own kind of stimulus package.

Doctor Strunk frets over separating the Siamese Twins Popsicle, even though he has performed the operation a thousand times.

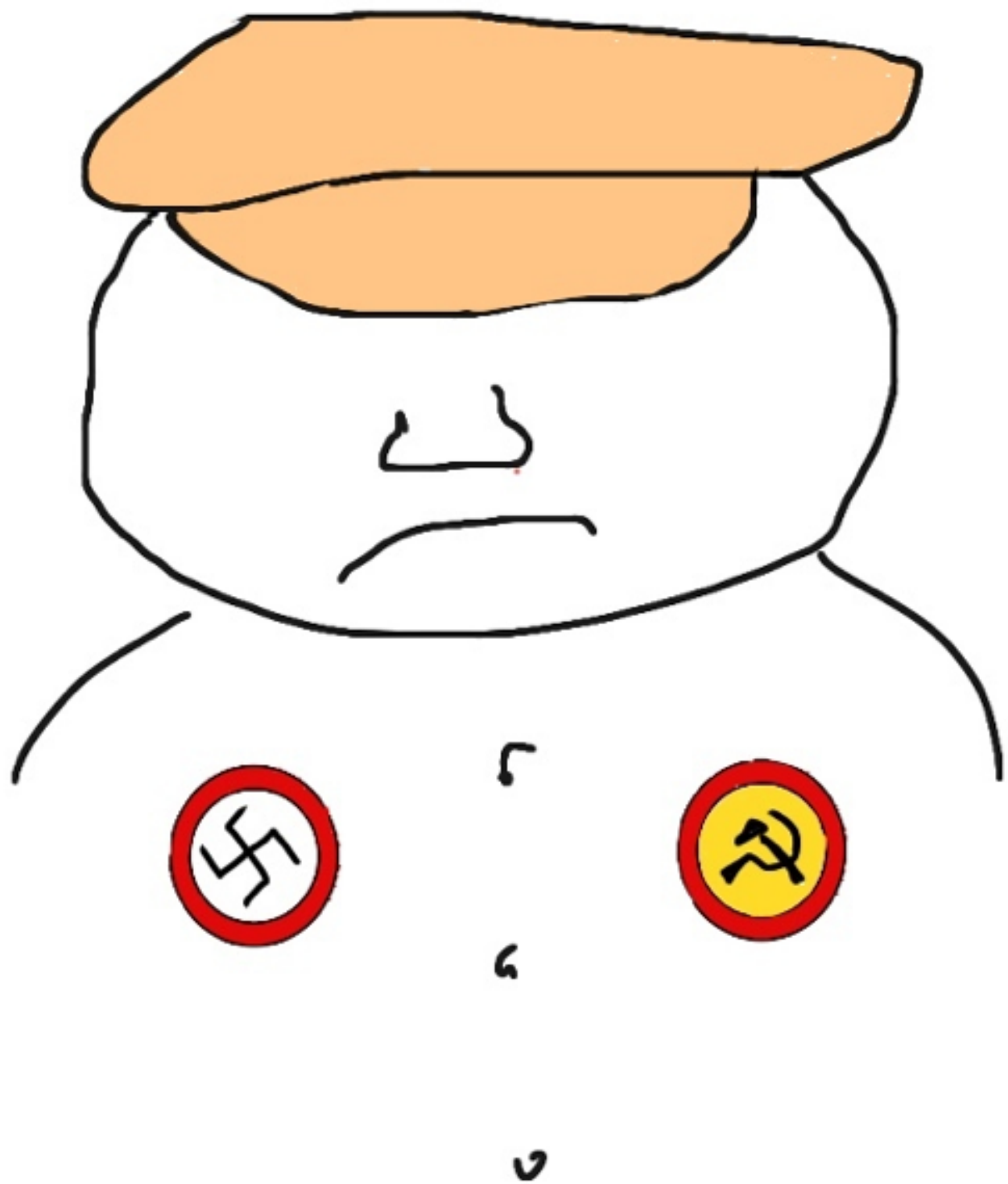


Some say the Wicked Witch disappeared without a trace, others disagree.

The winner in the city council election successfully portrayed Alex as a flip-flopper.



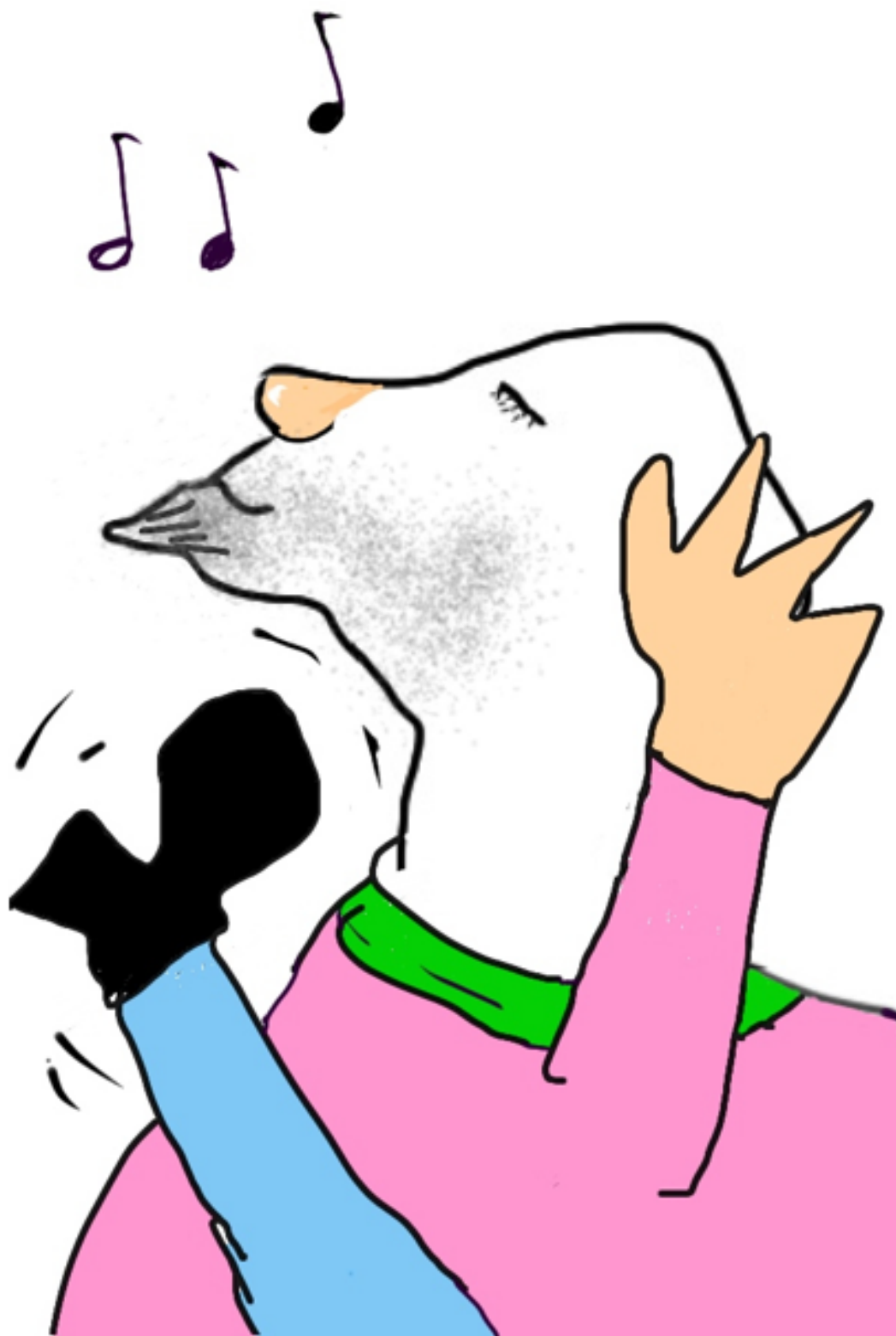

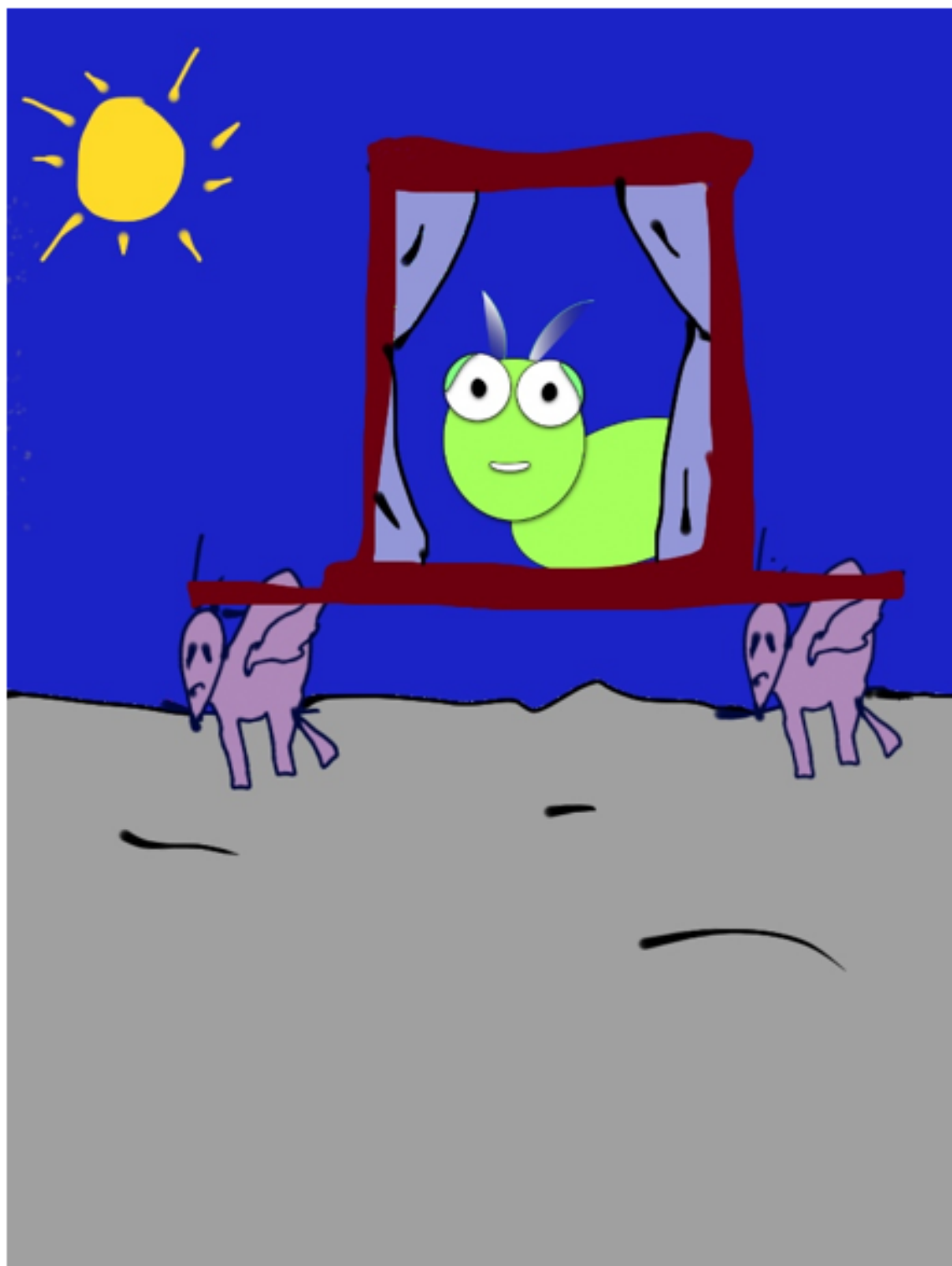
Mark Hammond's steam-powered chicken was far too ahead of its time.
