Recipe of the Month

ERROR DELIGHT*

"A surprising little desert that will be sure to please your guests."

- 2 cups wood chips
- 3 large eggs--whole with shells
- 1 tbsp. quick lime
- 1 qt. formaldehyde
- 1 box cornstarch
- rind of one rutabaga
- hemlock juice to taste
- pocketful of garbage (it's free)



Sift dry ingredients into a LARGE cauldron and cautiously stir in the liquids. Heat to boiling and add rutabaga rind and hemlock. Cool down. The resulting mixture can be used as an excellent paint. Add three well beaten eggs and garbage to bring mixture to consistency of chowmein. Drop by teaspoonsful on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 273 degrees Kelven, for 4 minutes 3½ seconds or until light chartreuse in color.
